I regularly see applications from members of organizations outside ours because they realize that artistic growth is a benefit of the jurying process.

If you are feeling a bit timid about the process, I'd like to assure you that members of the Jury of Selection are fellow painters, your peers, who view their role in this as instructors and mentors, as well as jurors.

The jurying process is anonymous and impartially viewed. Decisions are based on criteria that judges the artist's demonstration of ability to consistently demonstrate creative use of watercolor techniques and design concepts in a series of works.

I encourage all Associate and future members to try something new this year; give the jurying process a try. It's done fairly, impartially, and is a way to grow as an artist with constructive feedback on your work.

Save the dates

Our one day workshops are in full swing! The new location for one day workshops at St. James Annex in Clinton has worked out really well. Students noted that it's a wonderful space with great lighting, one table per person and enough room so that more people can be accommodated. So be sure to sign up when you receive notification via email and let's have some fun together!

April 19 our first workshop of the year will appropriately be "April Showers bring May Flowers" taught by Bonnie Bergen. This workshop will cover single stroke multiple color manipulation, wet into wet shading and dry brush affects. Who doesn't love spring and flowers? Sign-ups will be coming soon, look for them in your email.





May 6 Next up we have Sue Murphy giving us all "the Midas touch."
Come and try out new metallic watercolors while painting a landscape.
We will also experiment with fake "Gold leaf." Bring your own materials but Sue will supply the metallics.

June 6, Eric Shute teaches us "From Start to Finish."

This one day workshop will guide us through the process of creating a two hour Plein Air painting. The process will be expanded to focus on each element of a 1-2 hour plein air painting.

Morning: We will select an image, create an effective value study and create a viable color scheme for the subject. Each aspect will be informed by short exercises and demonstrations.

Afternoon: Using the same image you will use the morning's work to guide you thru the creation of a completed watercolor of that same image followed by a critique and group discussion of the completed works.

"Starting art school and all thru the early years as an illustrator I was encouraged to paint in many different mediums and styles. I tried them all but, in the end, I settled on watercolor. The spontaneity and flow just fit my personality and style. One of the things asked of the artist is to define what inspires them to do what they do. After giving it some thought the one thing that comes to mind before anything else is the play of sunlight, indoors or out, which defines and creates a mood." I felt this is something we all can relate and aspire to.

Ken graduated from the American Academy of Art in 1980 with an Associate degree in illustration and Watercolor. Shortly after he began his successful freelance career, which had lead to the creator of over 500 illustrations for books magazines, art publisher, advertising agencies and corporations. In 1993-94 Ken studied painting in Paris, France. Don't we all envy that!

Most recently, he has primarily worked with fine art and portraiture. He has many awards and has signature status in the American Watercolor Society, National Watercolor Society, Missouri Watercolor Society, Montana Watercolor Society along with being a Master Signature member with the Transparent Watercolor Society of America and Illinois Watercolor Society. Ken has been awarded over 30 Best in show in National and International competitions including the prestigious Skyledge award in 2020 TWSA International Exhibit. How fabulous!

These days he stays busy teaching workshops, jurying and judging exhibitions and lives in Northbrook, Illinois with his wife and two children.

Featured Artist: inside their creative world



ERIC SHUTE

CNYWS: Let us be the first to say "Welcome Eric", you are a new member to CNYWS as well a new Signature member, You also have joined our Board of Directors. We are happy to have you on board. Your creativity expands in a variety of mediums and subjects, please tell us what you have been up to of late?

Eric: In addition to my work with watercolor and abstract painting I meet with a figure drawing group every Saturday morning at the Delavan Center. This is a challenge I am not sure I will ever conquer. Interpreting the figure in watercolor in real time is very difficult for me, but I love trying. The drawing of the figure, the time constraints of getting the image complete, exploring the most effective way to complete a satisfying image, it's all very challenging. In addition I recently have been exploring making Mezzotints, but to date have nothing to show for it.

CNYWS: That is challenging indeed. Tell us a bit about your background in art.

Eric: I started drawing lessons early at the Everson and took as many art classes as I could in high school. I started undergraduate work as an art major, but much to my regret changed majors early on. Later in life, I returned to get an Associate degree in commercial art and then a BA in Fine Art at SU. Up until COVID I would take regular workshops and classes at WSA (jWoodstock School of Art). With respect to watercolor, I think my most valuable training has been from my own work reading books on technique, studying the work of artists I admire and trying to understand what they did to create their work.

CNYWS: What inspires you to paint?

Eric: I don't really know how to answer that question, it's just something I need to do. I get frustrated and discouraged a lot; but I still want to continue painting in some way. I want to get better at it. I love those rare moments when I am not really thinking technically about what I'm doing and I create something I am really pleased with.







Featured Artist, Eric W. Shute ... continued

CNYWS: Who would you say has been your biggest influence on your artistic journey?

Eric: I don't know if I really have any one person, but I think my work with the artists at Woodstock School of Art have been the most beneficial to me. My abstract study with Jenny Nelson has been great and has spilled over into my watercolor work. Work with Lisa Mackie on monotypes and interpreting the figure with Richard Segalman has been very useful. The instructors I have worked with are practicing artists themselves and have shown me how to be willing to work on a piece without a preconceived idea of how it will turn out...this has been very difficult for me, learning how to follow the painting wherever it may lead and not try to forfeit into a preconceived image of what I want it to be.

CNYWS: You work in a variety of mediums not limiting yourself to watercolor, however, what is it about watercolor that attracts you?

Eric: I do work another mediums: I love painting abstracts in oil and acrylics, working with water based monotypes, but for some reason from a very early age I was interested in watercolors. The unpredictability is a challenge and the more experienced I get, the more I try to take advantage of that unpredictability to create my image. Ultra realism and complex compositions in watercolor are very popular now, but I am more attracted to works with simple motifs that demonstrate the fluid possibilities of a simple wash and the laying down of spontaneous strokes of color. To improve on those skills is my personal goal in watercolor.
